Congratulations on the purchase of your Palm Treo 650 smartphone from Bell. This guide will help you set-up your Treo and introduce you to some of the main features of your device.





Back panel components




Installing your Treo Battery

a. Press the release button and slide the battery door downward

b. Align the metal contacts on the battery with the metal contacts in the battery compartment, and then insert the battery at a 45-degree angle

c. Press the battery into place and replace the battery door

✓ To check your battery's power level, tap the battery icon in the top right hand corner of the screen.



Charging your Treo Battery


Connect the charger cable to the bottom of the smartphone and plug the AC charger into a wall outlet.

Activation

- Make sure your Treo is charged.
- If your screen is off, press **Phone/Send** to turn on the phone and wake up the screen. If the Keyguard is on, press **Center**.
- If the Treo radio is not powered on, press and hold **Power/End**.
- From the Phone screen, enter ##, then your **MSL (Master Subsidy Lock)**, then tap **Dial**.
- Using your stylus, place the cursor in the **Mobile Number** field and enter the **MDN** (phone number).
- Using your stylus, place the cursor in the **MIN** field and enter the **MIN** (usually the phone number).
- Tap **Save** at the bottom of the screen.

✓ Solid green light indicates full charge.

Note: four hours is recommended for a full charge.



Making your first phone call

- If your screen is off, press **Phone/Send** to turn on the phone and wake up the screen. If the Keyguard is on, press **Center**.
 - To send and receive calls, your phone must be connected to the network. If it is connected, the network status icon will appear at the top of the screen. If the icon does not appear, press and hold **Power/End**. You will hear a series of ascending tones as the phone begins a network search.
 - Using the number pad on the keyboard, enter the desired phone number.
 - Press **Phone/Send** to dial.
 - When your call is complete, press **Power/End** to hang up.
- ✓ Use the Volume button on the side of your phone to adjust your call volume.



Setting up your E-mail in VersaMail

- Go to **Applications** and select **VersaMail**.
 - Open the menus.
 - Select **Accounts**, then **Account Setup**.
 - Select **New**.
 - In the **Account Setup** screen, complete the following fields:
 - Account Name**, enter a descriptive name.
 - Mail Service**, from the dropdown menu, select your e-mail provider or **Other** if your provider is not listed.
 - If you chose **Other**, in the **Protocol** dropdown menu select POP, IMAP or Exchange ActiveSync. (Check with your e-mail service provider to find the protocol for your e-mail account.)
 - Click **Next**.
 - Enter your **Username** and **Password** and select **OK**.
 - Click **Next**.
 - Verify your **E-mail Address** and complete the following fields:
 - Incoming Mail Server**, this field will be pre-populated if your Mail Service was selected from the dropdown menu, otherwise check with your e-mail service provider
 - Outgoing Mail Server**, this field will be pre-populated if your Mail Service was selected from the dropdown menu, otherwise type **mail.1xbell.ca**
 - Click **Next**.
 - Click **Done**.
- ✓ To access symbols or accents, enter the character that corresponds to your desired symbol or accent, press the **ALT** key and then use the **Up** or **Down** arrows to highlight the desired character. Press **Center** to select.

Using the Internet

- Make sure your phone is turned on (see "Making your first phone call").
 - Go to **Applications** and select **Web**.
 - Tap in the **Address Bar** at the top of the screen and type in your desired web address.
 - Select **Go**
 - You can navigate the web page by tapping on the scroll bar on the right of the screen.
 - To select a link on the web page, simply tap it with the stylus.
- ✓ You can send an e-mail from a web page by selecting the e-mail link once you have configured an e-mail application.


Using the Camera

- Go to **Applications**
 - Select **Camera** if you would like to take a photo or **Camcorder** if you would like to record a video.
 - Your screen will show what the lens on the back of your phone is pointing to.
 - To take a photo, point to your desired subject and press **Center** to capture the photo.
 - To record a video, press **Center** to start recording and press **Center** again to stop.
 - After you take the photo/record your video, choose from the following options:
 - Select **Save** to keep the photo
 - Select **Delete** to discard it
 - Select **Send** to send the photo as a Messaging attachment, or
 - Select **Audio** to add a voice caption
- ✓ For self portraits, use the tiny mirror located beside the lens on the back of your phone to focus.

Synchronize your smartphone with your computer

[X] **WARNING** Before connecting your smartphone to your computer, install the Palm® Desktop software that came with your Treo™ 650 smartphone. Install the software that came with your smartphone even if you have a previous version of the Palm software on your computer.

- Insert the Software Installation CD into the CD drive on your computer. If you are installing on a Windows computer, the installer program runs automatically. If you are installing on a Mac, double-click the CD icon on the desktop, and then double-click the Palm Software pkg icon. Follow the onscreen instructions to complete the installation.
- Connect your smartphone to your computer and synchronize your smartphone with your computer.

Quick Tour

The Quick Tour is already installed on your smartphone. To open the Quick Tour, go to **Applications** and select **Quick Tour**.

Application Tips

Many screens have a **Tips** icon in the upper-right corner. Select the icon to view info about the tasks you can perform in that dialog box. You can also select menus **Options**, and then select **Tips**.

User documentation

Your User documentation contains detailed instructions for many of the features and applications available on your smartphone. The complete User Guide is located on the Palm Software Installation CD included with your device.

Check the **VersaMail® User's Guide** on the Software Installation CD for detailed instructions on **VersaMail** setup and use. Settings for many popular e-mail providers are included in the **VersaMail** setup application. If your e-mail provider is not listed, contact the e-mail provider for assistance. If you can receive, but not send e-mail, try mail.1xbell.ca as the outgoing mail (SMTP) server.

A README file on the Software Installation CD contains instructions to avoid compatibility issues when you upgrade to your **Treo™ 650 smartphone**. Follow the instructions to ensure a smooth transition to your new smartphone.

Definitions
